

Proposed changes to primary phase education in Attleborough

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that, Norfolk County Council intends to make a prescribed alteration to the following schools, in accordance with sections 19 (1) of the Education and Inspections Act 2006 from 1 September 2017, by changing the age range served and enlarging the schools as indicated:-

Explanatory note: Norfolk County Council has a duty to ensure a sufficient supply of school places to respond to housing growth and other demographic changes. A number of housing sites are under construction in Attleborough and others have planning consent. In the longer term there are plans to build some 4,000 houses in the town, which will be provided for by additional schools. The present proposal establishes an all-through primary system as a foundation for future growth and at the same time provides an additional 345 primary phase places to accommodate children from housing currently under construction.
