

## Primary education in Gayton, King's Lynn

Notice is given in accordance with section 19 (1) of the Education and Inspections Act 2006 that Norfolk County Council and the Governing Body of Gayton Church of England Voluntary Controlled Primary School, intend to make a prescribed alteration to Gayton Church of England Voluntary Controlled Primary School, Lynn Road, Gayton, King's Lynn PE32 1PA from 1 September 2018.

The proposal is to change the age range and expand the capacity of the school to 210 by creating a one form entry all-through primary school for pupils aged 4 – 11 on a new site\* in Gayton, Norfolk.

The current capacity of Gayton Church of England Voluntary Controlled Primary School is 125 and the proposed capacity will be 210. The current school roll is 151 pupils. The current admission number for the school is 18 and the proposed admission number is 30.

Explanatory note: In 2010, reorganisation of primary schools in the Grimston Cluster included the provision for Gayton Church of England Voluntary Controlled Infant School to change age range to become a 5 – 11 Primary School from September 2011. To enable this to happen, temporary accommodation was provided at the school and a commitment was made by Norfolk County Council to provide permanent accommodation.

\*A new site has been identified in the village, on the corner of Back Street and Winch Road for which a Planning application has been made.

Informal consultation events to discuss the planned construction scheme were held at the school in November 2015 and January 2016. The construction scheme also includes the relocation of the Gayton Goslings pre-school provision which is currently on the school site. As the pre-school is not run by the School Governors, this relocation does not form part of this Notice.
