

Consultation on Proposal to expand our Autistic Spectrum Disorder Specialist Resource Base at Hewett Academy, Norwich, Norfolk, from 1 January 2023

Our Proposal

Inspiration Trust would like to hear your views on our proposal for Hewett Academy, Cecil Road, Norwich, Norfolk, NR1 2PL **to add an additional 10 places to our existing 10 place Autistic Spectrum Disorder Specialist Resource Base (ASD SRB) from 1 January 2023.**

We appreciate that young people with autism spectrum disorder, can struggle to engage with learning and cope in a classroom without additional strategies and interventions. Since establishing our ASD Resource Base, we have seen the impact that support can make, to help young people to overcome their barriers to learning, be better able to cope and to be re-integrated into a mainstream setting, in which they can achieve their potential.

We are very keen to expand this support at Hewett Academy. Our Specialist Resource Base has the capacity for an extra 10 places, maintaining an enabling environment for SRB learners in a bespoke accommodation base. The Base will continue to be managed by the headteacher and governing body of Hewett Academy.

The Base will have a recurrent funding agreement to support an agreed staffing structure for the Specialist Resource Base, including resources, equipment and running costs associated with the Base.

Places at the Specialist Resource Base will be agreed through the County Councils' Autism Base Admissions processes and the school will be part of the decision-making process. It will grow to full capacity through this admissions process and may therefore not be full on 1 January 2023.

Specialist Resource Bases are a key part of Norfolk's Local Offer for children with special educational needs and their families and have been identified in Norfolk's SEND Strategy as a priority for development.

What is a Specialist Resource Base (SRB)?

Autism bases form part of the Specialist Resource Base programme in Norfolk and are a key component of Norfolk's SEND Local Offer, and of mainstream inclusion support to young people, families and the school system.

Autism Bases are areas within a mainstream school with a dedicated lead teacher and high levels of support staff. They are an integral part of the school and provide additional support from trained staff for young people with social communication difficulties or a diagnosis of autism.

Autism Bases provide a learning area which is calm and adapted to meet these needs. Young people can be taught in the Base or within mainstream classes as required. Pupils are supported to access mainstream classes alongside their peers as much as they are able to. The

balance of time spent between the Base and mainstream classes can vary and depends on each student's individual needs.

Placements at the Autism Base are permanent, and pupils will be on the roll of Hewett Academy. These places do not form part of the school published admission number (PAN) and are registered in addition to that number.

What are the benefits of this proposal?

The main driver for Inspiration Trust and the senior leaders of Hewett Academy is to meet the increased demand for specialist educational provision within our area and the needs of our most vulnerable learners. We feel our proposal would benefit young people because it will:

- support more students with special education needs and disabilities to be educated and thrive in their local school and community;
- enhance students' progress by effectively meeting their individual social communication and interaction needs;
- help facilitate better access to the curriculum and support students to achieve their potential;
- ensure that needs can be met locally avoiding the need for students to spend unnecessary time travelling to an appropriate school further away. This is better for young people and saves the taxpayer money in transport costs;
- increase the availability of places to meet the needs of students with SEND;
- address identified geographical, and age and phase gaps in SRB provision as identified in Norfolk's SEND Strategy;
- support the sharing of expertise and good autism practice as part our school and Trust.

Capital costs

There are no capital costs required for this proposal.
