





# Consultation on proposals to add Specialist Resource Bases (SRBs) at Lionwood Infant & Nursery School and Lionwood Junior School, Norwich from 1<sup>st</sup> February 2024.

### Our proposal

Inclusive Schools Trust would like to hear your views on our proposals to;

- establish an 8 place Specialist Resource Base (SRB) from 1 February 2024, at Lionwood Infant and Nursery School, Telegraph Lane East, Norwich, Norfolk NR1 4AN
- establish an 8 place Specialist Resource Base (SRB) from 1 February 2024, at Lionwood Junior School, Wolfe Road, Norwich Norfolk NR1 4HT

We appreciate that children and young people can struggle to engage with learning and cope in a classroom without additional strategies and interventions. A Resource Base can support children to overcome their barriers to learning, to be better able to cope and to be re-integrated into a mainstream setting, in which they can achieve their potential.

We are very keen to provide this support in our schools. Our bases will be part of the Specialist Resource Base network and are a key part of Norfolk's Local Offer for children with special educational needs and their families. This has been identified in Norfolk's Local First Inclusion Programme as a priority for development.

Our Specialist Resource Bases will be managed by the Heads of School at Lionwood Infant & Nursery School and Lionwood Junior School. As well as overseen by the Executive Head/CEO and the Trustees of Inclusive Schools Trust.

The SRB places will be allocated through Norfolk County Admissions processes and may not be full from 1 February 2024, but will grow up to full capacity through this admissions process.

### Our Early Years and Key Stage 1 Early Intervention Base

Our Early Intervention Base will be available to children and young people;

- With co-occurring needs, not limited to, but inclusive of neurodiversity traits, Social, Emotional and Mental Health and developmental needs
- That have a hybridity of needs which impact on child's ability to access mainstream provision without significant support on entry to the Specialist Resource Base
- who typically are identified are struggling with/or likely to struggle with transition into mainstream school
- Who may have previously sought a complex needs school placement due to lack of alternative choices, but would have their needs better met through access to mainstream community, provision, and inclusion at an Early Intervention Base.

We are looking to undertake a refurbishment programme to re-use a classroom in Lionwood Infant and Nursery School. There will need to be some capital works to install new toilets and some external works to establish secure outdoor provision. The capital costs will be covered by Norfolk County Council, as part of the Local First Inclusion programme.

### Our Key Stage 2 Additional Intervention Base

Our Additional Intervention Base will be available to children and young people;

- With co-occurring needs, not limited to, but inclusive of neurodiversity, Social Emotional and Mental Health (SEMH) needs and learning needs that may have resulted in school refusal and/or vulnerability to exclusion
- Who, typically, are too 'complex' for the existing SEMH, and Autism bases due to their hybridity of needs
- Who may have previously sought a complex needs school placement due to lack of alternative choices, but would have their needs better met through access to mainstream community, provision, and inclusion at an Additional Intervention Base.

We are looking to undertake a refurbishment programme to re-use a classroom in Lionwood Junior School as well as extensive work outside to establish secure outdoor provision. The capital costs will be covered by Norfolk County Council, as part of the Local First Inclusion programme.

### What are the benefits of this proposal

The main driver for Inclusive Schools Trust is to meet the increased demand for specialist educational provision within our area and to best meet the needs of our most vulnerable learners. We feel our proposal would benefit children and young people because it will:

- support more pupils with special education needs and disabilities to be educated and thrive in their local school and community;
- enhance pupils progress by effectively meeting their individual complex needs;
- help facilitate better access to the curriculum and support pupils to achieve their potential;
- ensure that needs can be met locally avoiding the need for pupils to spend unnecessary time travelling to an appropriate school further away. This is better for young people and saves the taxpayer money in transport costs;
- increase the availability of places to meet the needs of pupils with SEND;
- address identified geographical, and age and phase gaps in SRB provision as identified in Norfolk's SEND Strategy;
- support the sharing of complex need expertise and good practice as part of our school.




