



# Consultation on the proposed discontinuance of nursery provision for 2 year olds and raising of the lower age range from 2-11 to 3-11 Years at Northgate Primary School, Great Yarmouth

### Introduction

Northgate Primary School is an Academy within Kingfisher Schools Trust, with nursery provision, known as 'Sunflowers', commencing at the age of 2 years.

Kingfisher Schools Trust are unfortunately having to propose to discontinue the provision of nursery places for 2 year olds at the school and change the age range from 2-11 years to 3-11 years from 1 September 2024, due to physical capacity issues.

This consultation will run for **4 weeks from Monday 10<sup>th</sup> June 2024 to Friday 5<sup>th</sup> July 2024.** Kingfisher Schools Trust will then consider all comments received during the consultation period. They will then analyse all responses received during the consultation and then decide whether to proceed with a significant change request to the DfE with a view to changing the age range.

We will consult with all relevant stakeholders as required by law, when proposing these changes.

### Why are we proposing this change

Due to physical capacity issues within the school, the nursery setting will be unable to accommodate 2-year-olds in September 2024. The nursery usually takes a maximum of eight 2-year-olds in September each year. The Nursery also provides 24 places for 3- and 4-year-olds. These places are not affected by this proposal. The school was rated Good by Ofsted in July 2018.

The Trust had already anticipated a building capacity issue in September 2024 and submitted a planning application for a modular building to accommodate a new intake, however this request was declined as the proposed site is on a flood plain. In order to agree nursery provision for September 2024 we now need to reconsider arrangements as soon as possible.

The proposed change will mean that parents who wanted their 2-year-old children to attend the school's nursery from September 2024 will have to choose an alternative early years provider.

Children and parents/carers already accessing the nursery will not be affected by this change. They can still claim their funded entitlement per week for early years education. The early years education and preparation for starting school will continue as it does now.

The Trust and headteacher at Northgate Primary will continue to manage the nursery, as they do now.

# What impact will the changes have

- The Nursery will continue to be able to offer spaces for children aged 3-4 years.
- Other providers in the area are able to offer two-year-old children spaces from September 2024.
- The Trust intends to review the age range they offer at Northgate Primary School in the future if the planning position changes with a view to reinstating places for 2-year-olds.

The earliest this change could happen is 1st September 2024.
