



Consultation on Proposal to add an Autism Base at North Walsham High School, North Walsham, Norfolk, from 1 September 2023

Our Proposal

Enrich Learning Trust would like to hear your views on our proposal for North Walsham High School to add a 20 place Autism Base (Autistic Spectrum Disorder, Specialist Resource Base) from 1 September 2023.

Our Autism Base will be located in the Enterprise Centre building (commonly known as the Annexe, pictured below), within the North Walsham High School site. This proposal will be supported by a Norfolk County Council capital project to re-model the existing building in line with Autism friendly building specifications. This will create an enabling environment for our students in a bespoke accommodation base.



The proposal will also be supported by a recurrent funding agreement to support an agreed staffing structure, including resources, equipment and running costs associated with the Base.

Places at our Autism Base will be agreed through the County Councils' Autism Base Admissions processes and the school will be part of the decision-making process. It will grow to full capacity through this admissions process and it is proposed to look to fill a maximum of 10 places initially, from 1st September 2023. The actual opening date is subject to a joint project with Norfolk County Council to consider building adaptions, recruitment of staff and wider operational set up considerations. The base will grow over time to fill the 20 places.

Autism Bases are part of the Specialist Resource Base network and are a key part of Norfolk's Local Offer for children with special educational needs and their families. This has been identified in Norfolk's SEND Strategy as a priority for development.

What is a Specialist Resource Base (SRB)?

Autism bases form part of the Specialist Resource Base programme in Norfolk and are a key component of Norfolk's SEND Local Offer, and of mainstream inclusion support to children, families and the school system.

Autism Bases are areas within a mainstream school with a dedicated lead teacher and high levels of support staff. They are an integral part of the school and provide additional support from trained staff for children with social communication difficulties or a diagnosis of autism.

Autism Bases provide a learning area which is calm and adapted to meet these needs. Children and young people can be taught in the Base or within mainstream classes as required. Pupils are supported to access mainstream classes alongside their peers as much as they are able to. The balance of time spent between the Base and mainstream classes can vary and depends on each student's individual needs.

Placements at the Autism Base are permanent, and pupils will be on the roll of North Walsham High School. These places do not form part of the school published admission number (PAN) and are registered in addition to that number.

What are the benefits of this proposal?

Enrich Learning Trust and senior leaders of North Walsham High School feel these changes would benefit children and young people because it will:

- support more students with special education needs and disabilities to be educated and thrive in their local school and community;
- enhance students' progress by effectively meeting their individual social communication and interaction needs;
- help facilitate better access to the curriculum and support students to achieve their potential;
- ensure that needs can be met locally avoiding the need for students to spend unnecessary time travelling to an appropriate school further away. This is better for young people and saves the taxpayer money in transport costs;
- increase the availability of places to meet the needs of students with SEND;
- address identified geographical, and age and phase gaps in SRB provision as identified in Norfolk's SEND Strategy;
- support the sharing of expertise and good autism practice as part our school and Trust. This has benefits to all students.

Capital costs

All capital costs for refurbishment will be funded from Norfolk County Council's SEND and Alternative Provision Transformation Programme to ensure there is the appropriate accommodation.

Please note there will be no major works i.e. noise, planned during exam periods and mock exam periods.
