

# Report on the consultation for school term and holiday dates for the academic years 2021/22 and 2022/23

#### 1. Introduction

Norfolk County Council undertook a consultation from 1 November - 13 December 2019. This set out a proposed standard pattern of dates for two academic years; 2021/22 and 2022/23. Each proposed academic year provides 190 teaching days, when schools must be open to pupils and which home to school transport will be provided. The pattern of dates included five suggested in-service training dates for each academic year and is set out in Appendix A. These dates had been developed the Eastern Region Term Dates Group, to ensure a co-ordinated approach to minimise the impact on families and school transport provision.

# 2. Consultation period


The consultation was published on the Council's website and sent to over 400 schools, via e-courier on 1 November 2019 and the consultation closed on 13<sup>th</sup> December 2019.

# 3. Analysis of consultation responses

A copy of the consultation analysis can be found in Appendix B.

### 3.1 Reponses

19 responses were received (last year we received 53 responses).



# 3.2 Proposed school term dates for 2021/2022

4 respondents (21%) strongly agreed and 5 respondents (26%) agreed with the proposed school term dates. The following comments were made in support of the proposal;

- The terms seem equally distributed
- Prefer whole school weeks

4 respondents (21%) neither agreed or disagreed.

2 respondents (11%) disagreed and 4 respondents (21%) strongly disagreed with the proposed school term dates. The following comments were made by those who did not support the proposal:

- Dates do not make sense in terms of appropriate timing for wellbeing, starting/ending terms on a shortened week is better for staff morale
- Do not like split weeks over summer holidays, used to be 6 straight weeks

## 3.3 Proposed staff training dates for 2021/2022

2 respondents (11%) strongly agreed and 5 respondents (26%) agreed with the proposed dates and gave the following reasons;

- Good spread over the year
- Same pattern as before

5 respondents (26%) disagreed and 3 respondents (16%) strongly disagreed with the proposed dates. Those that disagreed with the dates gave the following reasons;

- Prefer to have INSET at Autumn half term, rather than end of summer term
- 25 July training day would not work for staff
- Prefer the LA left schools to set their INSET days as other areas and Academy Trusts do.

# 3.4 Proposed school terms dates for 2022/2023

4 respondents (21%) strongly agreed and 5 respondents (26%) agreed with the proposed school term dates. The following comments were made in support of the proposal;

- The terms seem equally distributed
- 4 respondents (21%) neither agreed or disagreed.

3 respondents (16%) disagreed and 2 respondents (11%) strongly disagreed with the proposed school term dates. The following comments were made by those who did not support the proposal:

#### 3.5 Proposed staff training dates for 2022/2023

2 respondents (11%) strongly agreed and 6 respondents (32%) agreed with the proposed dates and gave the following reasons;

- Good spread over the year
- Equal terms

5 respondents (26%) neither agreed or disagreed.

3 respondents (16%) disagreed and 4 respondents (21%) strongly disagreed with the proposed dates. Those that disagreed with the dates gave the following reasons;

- Prefer INSET at Autumn half term, rather than end of summer term
- Prefer to break nearer to Christmas i.e. 20<sup>th</sup>, with training on 5/6 September and 21 July, or 4 January
- 25 July training day would not work for staff.

# 3.6 Schools linked to the respondents

16 respondents recorded the schools they were linked to. This included 14 primary phase schools and 3 secondary phase schools.

#### 4. Recommendation

The proposed Norfolk Model calendars for 2021/2022 and 2022/2023 are recommended for approval as;

- The response rate is low and the majority of respondents agreed with the proposed term dates
- The response rate is low and the responses were mixed on the staff training dates. Whilst there are suggestions for changing the staff training dates, please note it is made clear on the model calendar that these are suggested dates by the Local Authority. We suggest these dates to assist us with school transport provision.

Please note, the local authority has a responsibility to publish the school term dates 18 months before the start date of the 2020/2021 school calendar.

#### For information

In 2019/20, data from the annual school transport survey to all schools, showed 158 of all Norfolk schools adopted the Norfolk Model calendar.
