



Consultation on proposed changes to Watton Westfield Infant & Nursery School and Watton Junior School

Our Proposal

Corvus Education Trust would like to hear your views on our proposal for Watton Westfield Infant and Nursery School, West Road, Watton, Norfolk IP25 6AU and Watton Junior School, Brandon Road, Watton, Norfolk IP25 6AL to add a 16 place Social, Emotional and Mental Health Specialist Resource Base (SEMH SRB) from 1 April 2024, based at the Watton Junior School site.

We appreciate that children and young people with SEMH needs can struggle to engage with learning and cope in a classroom without additional strategies and interventions. A Resource Base can support children to overcome their barriers to learning, to be better able to cope and to be re-integrated into a mainstream setting, in which they can achieve their potential.

We are very keen to provide this support at our schools. Our Specialist Resource Base will be located behind Watton Junior School, still within the school grounds. It will be a new building, creating an enabling environment for SRB learners in a bespoke accommodation base. The Base will be managed by the Headteacher and governing body at Watton Westfield Infant & Nursery School and Watton Junior School.

Our proposal will have a recurrent funding agreement to support an agreed staffing structure for the Specialist Resource Base, including resources, equipment and running costs associated with the Base.

The local authority, Norfolk County Council is responsible for all admissions to Specialist Resource Bases. Referrals are considered by a County panel, and placements of pupils with or without an Education Health and Care Plan (EHCP) are made using eligibility criteria for pupils with an SEMH profile and assessing these against needs and appropriateness of referral.

The specialist resource base located at Watton Junior School, Brandon Road, Watton Norfolk IP25 6AL, will grow to full capacity through this admissions process and may therefore not be full on the 1 April 2024.

What is a Specialist Resource Base (SRB)?

Social, Emotional and Mental Health bases form part of the Specialist Resource Base programme in Norfolk and are a key component of Norfolk's SEND Local Offer, and of mainstream inclusion support to children, families and the school system.

Social, Emotional and Mental Health Bases provide a learning area which is calm and adapted to meet the needs of children and young people. It will be a primary phase base, offering up to 16 places for Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 children.

What are the benefits of this proposal?

The main driver for the Corvus Education Trust and the senior leaders of Watton Westfield Infant and Nursery School and Watton Junior School, is to meet the increased demand for specialist educational provision within our area, to best meet the needs of our most vulnerable learners. We feel our proposal would benefit children and young people because it will:

- support more students with special education needs and disabilities to be educated and thrive in their local school and community;
- enhance students' progress by effectively meeting their individual social, emotional and mental health needs;
- help facilitate better access to the curriculum and support students to achieve their potential;
- ensure that needs can be met locally avoiding the need for students to spend unnecessary time travelling to an appropriate school further away. This is better for young people and saves the taxpayer money in transport costs;
- increase the availability of places to meet the needs of students with SEND;
- address identified geographical, and age and phase gaps in SRB provision as identified in Norfolk's SEND Strategy;
- support the sharing of SEMH expertise and good practice as part our school and Trust.

Capital costs

All capital costs for the new purpose built accommodation will be funded from Norfolk County Council's SEND and Alternative Provision Transformation Programme, to ensure there is the appropriate accommodation.
