



Consultation on Proposal to add a Social, Emotional and Mental Health Base at Winterton Primary School and Nursery, Norfolk from 1 September 2025

Our Proposal

Consortium Trust would like to hear your views on their proposal to add an 8 place Social, Emotional and Mental Health (SEMH) Base from 1 September 2025, at Winterton Primary School and Nursery, Black Street, Winterton-on-sea, Great Yarmouth, NR29 4AP.

We appreciate that children and young people with SEMH needs can struggle to engage with learning and cope in a classroom without additional strategies and interventions. A Base can support children to overcome their barriers to learning, to be better able to cope and to be re-integrated into a mainstream setting, in which they can achieve their potential.

We are very keen to provide this support in our schools. Our SEMH base will be part of the Base network and is a key part of Norfolk's Local Offer for children with special educational needs and their families. This has been identified in Norfolk's Local First Inclusion Programme as a priority for development.

The SEMH Base places will be allocated through Norfolk County Admissions processes and may not be full from 1 September 2025, but will grow up to full capacity through this admissions process.

Our SEMH Base

We are looking to undertake an extension off an existing class base near the Studio Hall and provide extra play area lost due to this expansion. The extension will provide a classroom, breakout room and single toilet for our special resource base. This base will be managed by the school's Academy Head, supported by the Trust's central team. Consortium's Trustees fully support the development of Bases in Trust schools and contributing to the availability of places for pupils with SEND in the East.

What is a SEMH Base ?

Social, Emotional and Mental Health base forms part of the Base programme in Norfolk and is a key component of Norfolk's SEND Local Offer, and of mainstream inclusion support to children, families, and the school system.

Social, Emotional and Mental Health Bases provide a learning area which is calm and adapted to meet the needs of children and young people. This will be a primary phase base, offering up to 8 places for Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 children.

What are the benefits of this proposal?

The main driver for Consortium Trust and the senior leaders of Winterton Primary School and Nursery, is to meet the increased demand for specialist educational provision within our area, to best meet the needs of our most vulnerable learners. We feel our proposal would benefit children and young people because it will:

- support more pupils with special education needs and disabilities to be educated and thrive in their local school and community;
- enhance pupils progress by effectively meeting their individual social, emotional and mental health needs;
- help facilitate better access to the curriculum and support pupils to achieve their potential;
- ensure that needs can be met locally avoiding the need for pupils to spend unnecessary time travelling to an appropriate school further away. This is better for young people and saves the taxpayer money in transport costs;
- increase the availability of places to meet the needs of pupils with SEND;
- address identified geographical, and age and phase gaps in SRB provision as identified in Norfolk's SEND Strategy;
- support the sharing of SEMH expertise and good practice as part our school and Trust.

Capital costs

All capital costs for the refurbished accommodation will be funded from Norfolk County Council's Local First Inclusion Programme, to ensure there is the appropriate accommodation.
