

Your views on our proposal to save money by reducing the opening hours of the Norfolk Record Office

## Introduction

Norfolk County Council will set a new budget on 21st February 2023.

In this consultation we are asking for your views on reducing the opening hours of the Norfolk Record Office.

We want to find out what people think about our proposed increase in council tax.

# Why we are consulting

We are consulting through:

We are consulting from 21<sup>st</sup> October to 16<sup>th</sup> December 2022. Please note that if we receive any consultation responses after this date, we cannot guarantee that we will be able to take them into account.

We will feed back the findings from our consultation to our county councillors as part of the evidence they will use to help them come to a decision about our budget proposals.

#### Overview

Norfolk County Council is committed to making Norfolk a county where businesses, organisations and communities continue to thrive together. Our <a href="Better Together">Better Together</a>, For <a href="Norfolk">Norfolk</a> strategy sets out the Council's five, interlinked, priorities: a vibrant and sustainable economy; better opportunities for children and young people; healthy, fulfilling and independent lives; strong, engaged and inclusive communities; and a greener, more resilient future.

We also continue to face very significant challenges and uncertainty as we continue to work to bridge a £60 million budget gap - which will be increased further by inflation and cost of living. Initial proposals to save £13 million as part of a £60 million target for next year were considered by councillors on 4th July. In September additional savings were identified, which took the total savings to £32.5 million - these will be considered by councillors on 3rd October.

As a part of these savings, we are proposing to reduce the opening hours of the Norfolk Record Office. This proposal would save us £22,000 in 2023/24.

The consultation should take between 10-15 minutes to complete.

# Personal information, confidentiality and data protection

We will use any personal information to understand how different groups of people feel about our budget proposals.

We will process any personal information we receive from you in line with the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) (Regulation (EU) 2016/679), the Data Protection Act 2018 and Norfolk County Council's data protection policy and guidelines. This means that Norfolk County Council will hold your personal data and only use it for the purpose for which it was collected, being this consultation. We won't identify individuals when reporting back our findings and under our record management policy we will keep this information for five years. We will also, under normal circumstances, not pass your personal data on to anyone else. However, we may be asked under access to information laws to publish or disclose some, or all, of the information you provide in response to this consultation. We will only do this where such disclosure will comply with such relevant information laws which include the Freedom of Information Act 2000, the Data Protection Act 2018 and the Environmental Information Regulations 2004.

You can choose not to take part in the consultation, to stop responding at any time, or to ignore any personal questions that you do not want to answer.

#### Our current service

The Norfolk Record Office (NRO) collects and preserves unique archives relating to the history of Norfolk and makes them accessible to people in the county and across the world. Our team conserve documents, run education programmes, provide research advice and act as a first point of contact for people who are new to using the archives. As well as providing access to records used in historical research, the NRO acts a place of record for information relating to government, administration and citizenship.

One of the services that the NRO offers is a public searchroom where people can access the collection. This is open to anyone and is free of charge (many of the documents held by the NRO are covered by legislation and the public have a right of access to them).

As well as accessing original documents produced from the strongrooms, the public can use microfilms, online and printed sources. An essential part of the service offered is face-to-face advice; without this people who use the service would have great difficulty navigating their way through the enormous amount of information available. An archivist and two or three members of support staff are needed to operate the searchroom.

Currently, the NRO opens Tuesday to Friday, 10am to 5pm - totalling 28 hours per week.

### **Previous consultations**

In 2018, we asked for your views about reducing the number of hours that the searchroom would be open from 41.5 hours a week to between 28 and 30 hours a week. Around 43% of people that responded to our consultation said they either 'agreed' or 'strongly agreed' with our proposal. Since that consultation, the searchroom at the NRO has been open for 28 hours a week.

# Our proposal

Norfolk County Council is proposing to change the opening hours of the NRO. Currently, the NRO opens from Tuesday to Friday, from 10am to 5pm – a total of 28 hours each week.

Our proposal is to close the NRO to the public on a Friday, but to extend the opening hours on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, by opening half an hour earlier.

This means the NRO's new opening hours would be from Tuesday to Thursday, from 9.30am to 5pm. If our proposals are approved, the NRO will be open for 22.5 hours each week in the future.

Please note that the opening hours at the King's Lynn Borough Archive would be unchanged. This consultation only applies to the Norfolk Record Office.

## What we have considered when developing our proposal

We have analysed the days and times that people tend to visit the NRO's searchroom. We collected this information between 13 April 2021 (when we reopened with reduced hours after the Covid-19 lockdown) and September this year.

We considered opening later in the day, however we found that most visitors arrive before 11am, therefore this wouldn't be suitable. It is worth noting the data below contains times that the searchroom closed at lunchtime during the pandemic, however it still shows that the most popular visiting times were during the morning period.

We do not propose closing at lunchtime as this has proven inconvenient for many of our users.

This proposal would save us £22000 in 2023/24.

We will take a report about the findings of this consultation to the Council Cabinet in January 2023. We will set a new budget on 21st February.

Our county councillors will consider the consultation responses we receive very carefully. In particular, they will take into account:

- The impact of any proposal on individuals, groups of communities and in particular on people identified as having 'protected characteristics' under the Equality Act 2010. The protected characteristics are: age; disability; gender reassignment; pregnancy and maternity; race; religion or belief; sex; and sexual orientation. As well as this equality impact assessment, councillors will consider the impact of proposals on rural areas.
- The views of people and stakeholders consulted.
- The evidence of need and what is proven to work effectively and well.
- The financial and legal positions and any constraints at the time.
- Any potential alternative options, models or ideas for making savings.
