

Norfolk County Council's idea to change the opening hours of the Norfolk Record Office and introduce a booking system.





Some of the things in this paper are not easy to understand.

Norfolk County Council is responsible for a lot of things in Norfolk.



Services such as libraries, the fire service and recycling centres (and lots of other things too!).



To do this, we spend over a billion pounds each year.



We must be sure the money we spend matches the money we get in.
This is hard to do at the moment.





Things are getting more expensive. The money we get in isn't covering what things now cost.



We need to save money by cutting what we spend. We have been saving money between 2011 and 2023. However, we need to save another £41.5 million in 2024.



We have already asked people about our budget and council tax rises in October 2023.



However, we got less money from the government than we thought we were going to get this year.



We have £4 million less than we thought we were going to have this year.



So we need to save some money, by reducing what we spend.



We want to hear what you think of one of the ideas we have to save money.



Our idea is about the Norfolk Record Office also called the NRO.



The NRO collects and looks after records from the past that help us understand our history.



People can visit the NRO and look at the information about Norfolk.

Tuesday -Thursday





Current

Currently, the NRO opens Tuesday to Thursday, 9.30 am to 5pm where documents are available throughout the day.

Friday





Current

On Friday, the NRO operates a Reduced Service. This means the record office is open from 10am to 4pm, and people can only access documents they have asked to see before they arrived.

Our idea is to also do a reduced service on Thursdays.

So, if this is idea is agreed, the new opening times would be:

Tuesday to Wednesday, from 9.30am to 5pm Thursday and Friday, from 10am to 4pm.

This means that documents will be available for people to see for 27 hours per week. At the moment they are available for 28.5 hours.



We would also introduce a booking system for the NRO. This means you would have to book an appointment before you arrive.



A booking system would make sure the NRO doesn't get too busy and our staff can help everyone they need to.



This idea would save the council £57,000 in 2024/25.
