What is the Transport for Norwich Strategy?

We want to improve transport in Norwich and we have shared a proposed new strategy for that could help us do that.

This consultation document explains ways we could make transport in Norwich better.

We would like your views which will help us develop the strategy and plans for transport in the Norwich area.



What do we mean by transport?

Transport moves people from one place to another. It also moves things from one place to another such as parcels, food or big things like machines.

The different types of transport include:

- Walking
- Buses
- Cars
- Cycling
- Taxis
- Community transport such as local buses and Car share schemes
- Trains
- Aeroplanes
- People who use wheelchairs/mobility aides





How our new strategy could help transport in and around Norwich in the future?

It is important have plans for the future to include good transport connections in Norwich as it will help the area grow. We also need to think about future generations. Our strategy has nine themes to help us make those plans.

These themes are:

- Norwich and Norfolk
- A zero-carbon future
- Improving the quality of our air
- Changing attitudes and behaviours
- Supporting growth areas
- Meeting local needs
- Reducing the dominance of traffic
- Making the transport system work as one



Norwich and Norfolk

Norwich is a growth area for Norfolk. This means the number of people living in the area is expected to grow, so we need good transport connections to help connect Norwich to other areas in Norfolk.

A zero-carbon future



Reducing carbon means we will have to have more active travel such as cycling and walking.

We can think about cars which work by using electricity and this will help with improving our environment.

Petrol and diesel give off gas and that makes climate change worse.



Improving the quality of our air

Clean air is important for our good health. One of the ways we could get cleaner air is stopping petrol and diesel cars.



Changing attitudes and behaviours

People need to feel confident about travelling in different ways such as taking a bus or cycling.

Supporting growth areas



We need to provide the right transport links and facilities to help support growth in the area. Our strategy suggest we give a priority to walking, cycling, buses and trains.

Meeting local needs

Transport systems needs to help people and products move about and should be designed to help different needs and different people.



Reducing the dominance of traffic

One way we can reduce the number of journeys made by cars, taxis, trucks and vans is to have areas with low traffic flows and streets just for schools.

Making the transport system work as one

We can find areas where buses, walking and cycling can be given priority. We can identify roads where traffic is given priority and we can support areas where lots of people live, work and relax.
