

Your views on our proposal to save money by reducing weed spraying activities on the highway

#### **Overview**

Norfolk County Council will set a new budget on 21<sup>st</sup> February 2023.

In the consultation we are asking you for your views on proposals to reduce the frequency of weed control from two treatments per year to one treatment per year. This proposal would save us £130,000 in 2023/24.

## Personal information, confidentiality and data protection

#### Introduction

Norfolk County Council is committed to making Norfolk a county where businesses, organisations and communities continue to thrive together. Our <a href="Better Together">Better Together</a>, For <a href="Norfolk">Norfolk</a> strategy sets out the Council's five, interlinked, priorities: a vibrant and sustainable economy; better opportunities for children and young people; healthy, fulfilling and independent lives; strong, engaged and inclusive communities; and a greener, more resilient future. We're proud to provide the valuable services that our residents need and deserve.

However, we continue to face significant challenges which includes higher costs and demand for services, this was the case even before the recent rise in inflation and cost of living. There were two phases to our budget planning; phase one included initial proposals to save £13 million, these were considered by councillors on 4<sup>th</sup> July and phase 2 savings were considered by councillors on 3<sup>rd</sup> October, when an additional £19.5 million in savings were presented to councillors. Together, this brings the total savings to £32.5 million.

As we continue with huge uncertainty around our finances

Norfolk County Council is continuing to work to bridge the gap in our budget with a target of £60 million.

In this consultation we are asking for your views on our proposal to reduce the frequency of weed control from two treatments per year to one treatment per year. This proposal would save us £130,000 in 2023/24.

#### **Our current service**

Norfolk County Council has a legal duty to maintain our highways and this includes roads, footpaths and verges, making them safe for road users. We meet this duty through a wide range of maintenance activities including weed control.

We spray weeds on adopted roads (public highways) and pavements, and also deal with ragwort, thistles, nettles, brambles and giant hogweed on the highway. Weed control normally starts in May or June with a second treatment in July or August.

We treat weeds with an environmentally friendly weed killer, which works on contact with weeds and is harmless to humans and animals. It is approved for use by the European Union and the HSE Chemicals Regulation Directorate. The weed killer used is no stronger than products sold at DIY stores.

## Our proposal

Across Norfolk, our contractors treat the network of adopted roads (public highways) and pavements twice, based on a schedule of sites where weed growth is an issue. We are proposing to save money by reducing the number of weed control treatments from two across the county, to one.

This proposal would save us £130,000 in 2023/24.

## Who would be affected by our proposal and how

Reducing the frequency of weed control may result in adopted roads (public highways) and pavements looking less visually pleasing. Some weeds spread quickly and can cause damage to hard surfaces which is costly to repair.

We do not anticipate a reduction in weed control having any direct adverse safety impacts for communities.

## How we will make our decision and report back to you

We will take a report about the findings of this consultation to the Council Cabinet in January 2023. We will set a new budget on 21st February.

Our county councillors will consider the consultation responses we receive very carefully. In particular, they will take into account:

- The impact of any proposal on individuals, groups of communities and in particular on people identified as having 'protected characteristics' under the Equality Act 2010. The protected characteristics are: age; disability; gender reassignment; pregnancy and maternity; race; religion or belief; sex; and sexual orientation. As well as this equality impact assessment, councillors will consider the impact of proposals on rural areas.
- The views of people and stakeholders consulted.
- The evidence of need and what is proven to work effectively and well.
- The financial and legal positions and any constraints at the time.
- Any potential alternative options, models or ideas for making savings.
