

THE NORFOLK COUNTY COUNCIL
(KING'S LYNN, HIGHGATE AND EASTGATE RESIDENTIAL AREA (KR04)
(CONTROLLED ZONE AND PERMIT PARKING AREA) ORDER 2016

The Norfolk County Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of their powers under Sections 1(1), 2(1), 2(2) and 4(1) and (2), 32(1) and 35(1), 45 and 46 and 122 and Parts III and IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") and the Traffic Management Act 2004 (hereinafter referred to as "the 2004 Act") and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order shall come into operation on the 26th day of February 2016 and may be cited as The Norfolk County Council (King's Lynn, Highgate and Eastgate Residential Area (KR04) (Controlled Zone and Permit Parking Area) Order 2016.

PART 1 – GENERAL

2. In this Order –

Any reference to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment. Where the context otherwise requires the following expressions have the meaning hereby respectively assigned to them.

"authorised taxi rank" means any area of carriageway which is comprised within and indicated by a road marking complying with diagram 1028.2 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002;

"Council" means The Norfolk County Council, their Permit Agent or their Enforcement Agent as defined in this Order;

"Civil Enforcement Officer" has the same meaning as in section 76 of the Traffic Management Act 2004;

"Driver" in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place, means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place, or the person deemed to be the driver under the terms of this Order;

"Disabled Person's Vehicles" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;

"Disabled Persons Badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles)(England) Regulations 2000; and

"Parking Disc" means a disc, issued by a local authority, complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specification for Parking Discs (BS No 3551 : 1970), but coloured blue and capable of showing the quarter hours period during which a period of waiting begins; and

for the purposes of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying a disabled person's badge in the relevant position, when

- (a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen
- (i) the badge is exhibited facing forwards of the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen, and
 - (ii) the parking disc is exhibited in the relevant position with the side which shows the time facing forwards or outwards and immediately behind the windscreen, and
- (b) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen the badge or disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the side of the vehicle;

“Enforcement Agent” means Norfolk County Council or their appointed person to administer such functions on their behalf pursuant to an Agreement under The Local Government Act 2000;

“Enforcement Authority” means the Council;

“General Directions” means the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002;

“General Regulations 2007” means The Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (England) General Regulations 2007;

“Hackney Carriage” has the meaning as in Section 38 of the Town Police Clauses Act 1847;

“Motor Car”, “Motor Cycle” and “Invalid Carriage” shall have the same meaning as in section 136 of the Act;

“Parking Place” means a length of road specified in Column 1 of Schedule 3 to this Order indicated as an area where a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of this Order may be stationed;

“Penalty Charge” has the same meaning as in section 2 of the General Regulations;

“Penalty Charge Notice” has the same meaning as in section 8 of the General Regulations 2007;

“Parking Permit” means:-

- (i) a Residents Parking Permit,
 - (ii) a Residents Visitors Parking Permit,
 - (iii) a Residents 24 hour Visitors Scratchcard Parking Permit
 - (iv) a Residents 24 hour Visitors Virtual Parking Permit
- valid for the KR04 Parking Permit Area as specified in this Order.

“Parking Permit Charge” means the charge made by the Council for a Parking Permit as specified in Schedule 4 to this Order;

“Penalty Charge” has the same meaning as in section 2 of the General Regulations 2007;

“Penalty Charge Notice” has the same meaning as in section 8 of the General Regulations 2007;

“Permit Agent” means Norfolk County Council or their appointed person to administer such functions on their behalf pursuant to an Agreement under The Local Government Act 2000;

“Prohibited Area” in relation to a specified road, shall mean all that area of a specified road which is comprised within and indicated by a road marking complying with the General Directions;

“Resident” means a legal owner/occupier of a property situated within the KR04 Parking Permit Area;

“Residents Parking Permit” means a Parking Permit as set out under Article 9 of this Order;

“Residents Visitors Parking Permit” means a Parking Permit as set out under Article 10(i) of this Order;

“Residents 24 hour Visitors Scratchcard Permit” means a Parking Permit as set out under Article 10(ii) of this Order;

“Residents 24 hour Visitors Virtual Parking Permit” means a Parking Permit as set out under Article 10(iii) of this Order;

“the 1997 Regulations” shall mean the Zebra, Pelican and Puffin Pedestrian Crossing Regulations 1997.

“the regulations” in Article 3 of this Order means The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles)(England) Regulations 2000” and The Local Authorities’ Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons)(England) Regulations 2000;

3. Nothing in Part 2 of this Order shall prohibit a person to cause or permit a disabled person’s vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person’s badge, and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait in the lengths of road or on the side of roads referred to in those Parts for a period not exceeding the time specified in the regulations subject to compliance with all other provisions of this Order provided:
 - (a) the driver of the vehicle is a disabled person to whom the badge was issued in respect of that vehicle;
 - (b) the vehicle is being used for the carriage of a disabled person to whom the badge was issued;
 - (c) the vehicle is one being used for the carriage of disabled persons by an institution to whom the badge was issued in respect of that vehicle; or
 - (d) the time during which the vehicle will be parked in the said parking bay is indicated on the parking disc provided by local authority for that purpose.
4. Insofar as any provision of this Order conflicts with any provision of any previous Order relating to the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this Order, that provision of this Order shall prevail.

5. Insofar as any provision of this Order conflicts with:-
- (a) the effect of markings placed on the carriageway, as specified under Regulation 29(1) of the General Directions conveying the existence of a 'bus stop/clearway' as defined by Part 1 of Schedule 19 of the General Directions; or
 - (b) the effect of markings placed on the carriageway, as specified under Regulation 27(1) of the General Directions conveying the existence of a toucan or equestrian crossing or an adjacent controlled area as defined by Sign 1001.3 in Schedule 6 of the General Directions; or
 - (c) the effect of markings placed on the carriageway, as specified under s3(1) of the 1997 Regulations conveying the existence of a:-
 - (i) Zebra Pedestrian Crossing or Zebra controlled area; or
 - (ii) Pelican Pedestrian Crossing or Pelican controlled area; or
 - (iii) Puffin Pedestrian Crossing or Puffin controlled areaand established as specified in s23(2) of the 1984 Act;
- the effect of those markings shall prevail.

PART 2 – PROHIBITION OF WAITING

6. Save as provided in Article 7 of this order no person shall, except upon the direction of or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a Civil Enforcement Officer, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time along the lengths of road specified in Schedules 1 and 2 to this Order.
- 7.(1) Nothing in Article 6 of this Order shall prohibit a person to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths of road or on the side of roads referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable –
- (a) goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle;
 - (b) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
- provided that the length of road is not an authorised taxi rank or authorised parking place.
- (2) Nothing in Article 6 of this Order shall prohibit a person to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the length of road or on the side of roads referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable –
- (a) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely –
 - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said lengths of road or side of roads; or
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to, the said lengths of road or side of roads, of any sewer or of any main,

pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;

- (v) the provision of a universal postal service as defined in the Postal Services Act 2000;
 - (b) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- (3) Nothing in Article 6 of this Order shall apply to any vehicle owned by a funeral director or owner of funeral vehicles when in use as part of a funeral cortege.
- (4) Nothing in Article 6 of this Order shall prohibit a person to cause or permit any vehicle being a hackney carriage, to wait upon an authorised taxi rank.

PART 3 – PERMIT PARKING PLACES

8. The lengths of carriageway specified in column 1 of Schedule 3 to this Order are authorised to be used, subject to the following provisions of this Order, by such classes of vehicles, in such positions and on such days and during such operational hours as are specified in relation to that section of road in columns 2-6 of the said Schedule.

Residents Parking Permits

9. The driver of a vehicle, being a Resident of a property situated within the KR04 Permit Parking Area may, subject to the Council's discretion, apply to the Council for a Residents Parking Permit to be valid in respect of one specified vehicle for a period of up to twelve months from the date of issue. A Residents Parking Permit may be used to allow that specified vehicle to wait in a Parking Place within the KR04 Permit Parking Area as specified by the Parking Permit and in accordance with Schedule 3 to this Order.
10. A Resident of a property situated within the KR04 Parking Permit area may, subject to the Council's discretion, apply to the Council for:-
- (i) one Residents Visitors Parking Permit to be valid for a period of up to twelve months from the date of issue. A Residents Visitors Parking Permit may be used to allow a vehicle to wait in a Parking Place within the KR04 Parking Permit Area as specified by the Parking Permit and in accordance with this Order; OR
 - (ii) Residents 24 hour Visitors Scratchcard Parking Permits (up to a maximum of 365 scratchcards per year). A Residents 24 hour Visitors Scratchcard Parking Permit may be used to allow a vehicle to wait in a Parking Place within the KR04 Parking Permit Area for a period of up to 24 hours as specified by the Parking Permit and in accordance with this Order; OR
 - (iii) Residents 24 hour Visitors Virtual Parking Permits (up to a maximum of 365 per year). A Residents 24 hour Virtual Parking Permit may be used to allow a vehicle to wait in a Parking Place within the KR04 Parking Permit Area for a period of up to 24 hours as specified by the Parking Permit and in accordance with this Order.

Issue of Parking Permits

11. The issue of a Parking Permit is at the discretion of the Council and subject to receipt of the correct Parking Permit Charge for that Parking Permit as specified in Schedule 4 to this Order. The Council may limit the number of issue of any type of Parking Permit in respect of the Permit Parking Area. The Council shall not be obliged to issue any Parking Permit if doing so would exceed the permitted maximum number of Parking Permits for the Permit Parking Area.

Display of Parking Permits

- 12.(1) The driver of a vehicle using a Parking Permit issued in accordance with Article 9 of this Order and

- (a) which vehicle possesses a windscreen shall display the Parking Permit within the vehicle either by attaching it firmly to the front windscreen or by placing it on the dashboard of the vehicle;
- (b) which vehicle does not possess a windscreen shall display the Parking Permit in a conspicuous position,

so that the registration details, the period of eligibility and all other particulars appropriate to the Parking Permit as specified in this Order are clearly visible from outside the vehicle during the entire period the vehicle is waiting in a Permit Parking Area Parking Place.

- (2) The driver of a vehicle using a Parking Permit issued in accordance with Article 10(i) of this Order and

- (a) which vehicle possesses a windscreen shall display the Parking Permit within the vehicle either by attaching it firmly to the front windscreen or by placing it on the dashboard of the vehicle;
- (b) which vehicle does not possess a windscreen shall display the Parking Permit in a conspicuous position,

so that the period of eligibility and all other particulars appropriate to the Parking Permit as specified in this Order are clearly visible from outside the vehicle during the entire period the vehicle is waiting in a Parking Permit Area Parking Place.

- (3) The driver of a vehicle using a Parking Permit issued in accordance with Article 10(ii) of this Order and

- (a) which vehicle possesses a windscreen shall display the Parking Permit within the vehicle either by attaching it firmly to the front windscreen or by placing it on the dashboard of the vehicle;
- (b) which vehicle does not possess a windscreen shall display the Parking Permit in a conspicuous position,

so that the start time for the period of eligibility, the day and date and all other particulars appropriate to the Parking Permit as specified in this Order are clearly visible from outside the vehicle during the entire period the vehicle is waiting in a Parking Permit Area Parking Place.

- (4) A Parking Permit which is not displayed in accordance with Article 12(1), 12(2) or 12(3) of this clause is not valid.
13. The driver of a vehicle using a Parking Permit issued in accordance with Article 10(iii) must ensure the vehicle registration is registered on an account in an electronic database approved by the Council for enforcement of parking. Confirmation the vehicle by registration is eligible to wait, together with payment and period of eligibility must be available to a Civil Enforcement Officer via display on a hand-held enforcement facility or by reasonable enquiry.
14. A Parking Permit displayed in accordance with Articles 12(2), 12(3), 12(4) and 13 above shall be valid only for the duration the driver of the vehicle is a visitor to a Resident situated within the KR04 Parking Permit Area.
15. A Parking Permit issued in accordance with this Order shall not be considered valid for the purposes of this Order if:-
- (a) a Parking Permit which is required to be displayed is defaced or obstructed so that the particulars cannot be read from outside the vehicle, or
 - (b) the Parking Permit has expired by effluxion of time, or
 - (c) the Parking Permit has been declared invalid by the Council following any payment for that Parking Permit being dishonoured, or
 - (d) the driver of a vehicle displaying a Residents Parking Permit is no longer a Resident within the KR04 Parking Permit Area in accordance with this Order.
16. The driver of a vehicle shall not cause or permit a vehicle to wait in a Parking Place in the KR04 Parking Permit Area if that vehicle displays a Parking Permit which was purchased either for a different vehicle or for a different Parking Zone than that in which the vehicle is waiting.

All Parking Permits

17. Where a Parking Permit has been used contrary to the conditions of use of the Parking Permit or is otherwise in breach of the provisions of this Order the Council may declare that Parking Permit invalid.
18. A Parking Permit issued under Articles, 9 and 10(iii) of this Order shall not be valid for any vehicle other than the vehicle for which it was issued (whether or not that other vehicle is owned or is under the control of the driver).
19. A Parking Permit issued under Articles 10(ii) and 10(iii) of this Order shall be valid for the period specified on the Parking Permit. The date and time of issue for that Parking Permit must be entered, in ink on the Parking Permit and be clearly visible as specified in this Order.
20. Where in the Schedules to this Order the Parking Place is described, or is designated by surface or other markings, as available for vehicles of a specified class, the driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in the Parking Place, unless it is of the specified class.

21. The driver of a vehicle shall not cause or permit a vehicle to be left in a Parking Place in any position other than wholly within a Parking Place, nor cause or permit a vehicle to be left in such a position as to prevent the driving away of any vehicle already standing in a Parking Place or in such a position as to cause an obstruction to other vehicles.

Penalty Charge and Penalty Charge Notice

22. Where a vehicle is left waiting within the Permit Parking Area in contravention of this Order a Penalty Charge shall become payable. A Penalty Charge Notice to that effect will be attached to the vehicle or handed to the driver by a Civil Enforcement Officer, in accordance with Article 24 of this Order.
23. A Penalty Charge shall be payable to the Enforcement Authority.
24. A Penalty Charge Notice referred to in Article 22 and issued by a Civil Enforcement Officer shall include the following particulars:
- (a) the enforcement authority,
 - (b) the Parking Place at which the contravention occurred,
 - (c) the registration mark or when the vehicle is being used under a trade licence, the registration mark of that trade licence,
 - (d) the date and time at which the Penalty Charge was seen to be payable,
 - (e) the grounds on which the Civil Enforcement Officer serving the Penalty Charge Notice believes that a Penalty Charge is payable,
 - (f) the amount of the Penalty Charge,
 - (g) the manner in which and time within which the Penalty Charge shall be paid,
 - (h) a statement that a reduced charge may be payable if payment is made within fourteen days of the Penalty Charge Notice being incurred,
 - (i) a statement to the effect that if the Penalty Charge is not paid before the end of the period of 28 days a Notice to Owner may be served by the Enforcement Authority on the owner of the vehicle.
25. Where a driver has left a vehicle in contravention of this Order and a Penalty Charge Notice could not be issued as specified in Article 22 of this Order a Penalty Charge Notice may be issued by post by the Enforcement Authority in accordance with section 10 of the General Regulations 2007.
26. Any Penalty Charge Notice issued in accordance with Article 25 of this Order shall, in addition to the particulars specified in Article 24(a), (b), (c), (e) and (f) of this Order, include the particulars specified in paragraph 2 of the Schedule to the General Regulations 2007.

27. The driver of a vehicle in respect of which a Penalty Charge Notice has been incurred shall pay the Penalty Charge or provide proof of payment of the Penalty Charge to the Enforcement Authority as detailed on the reverse of the notice within 28 days of the date on which the Penalty Charge Notice is served. If payment is received within a period of 14 days beginning with the date on which the Penalty Charge Notice is served the amount of the Penalty Charge shall be reduced by 50% (provided that if the fourteenth day falls upon a day on which the Enforcement Authority's offices are closed the period within which payment of the said charge is due shall be extended to 1.00 p.m. on the next full day on which the office is open).
28. Where the driver of a vehicle fails to pay the Penalty Charge as specified in Article 27 of this Order the Enforcement Authority may follow the procedures set out in the General Regulations 2007 to recover the Penalty Charge.
29. The driver of a vehicle who desires to make representation to or appeal against a Penalty Charge Notice issued to him may make representation or appeal to the Enforcement Authority pursuant to the procedures set out in the Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (England) Representations and Appeals Regulations 2007.
30. Where a Penalty Charge Notice has been attached to a vehicle in accordance with Article 22 of this Order no person, not being the driver of the vehicle or a person duly authorised by the Enforcement Authority shall remove that Notice from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the driver.

USE OF PARKING PLACES

31. The driver of a vehicle using a Parking Place within the Parking Permit Area shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in that parking place and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in that parking place, or to depart from that Parking Place.
32. Except with the authority of the Council no person shall use a vehicle, whilst it is in a Parking Place within the Parking Permit Area in connection with the sale of any article to persons in or near that parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of his skill or services.
33. Except with the authority of the Council no person shall affix or cause to be affixed any advertising material to any vehicle left, in a Parking Place within the Parking Permit Area.
34. Subject to the proviso hereto, when a vehicle is left in a Parking Place within the Parking Permit Area in contravention of this Order, or it is necessary to meet the requirements of an emergency, a person authorised on behalf of the Council or a Police Constable in uniform may remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be removed from that parking place, or may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with the relevant provision or meet the requirements of that emergency.
35. Any person removing or altering the position of a vehicle by virtue of Article 34 of this Order may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or in such other manner as that person may think necessary and may take such measures in relation to the

vehicle as that person may think necessary to enable that person to remove or alter its position.

36. When a person authorised by the Council removes or makes arrangements for the removal of a vehicle from a Parking Place within the Parking Permit Area by virtue of Articles 34 and 35 of this Order, that person shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle.
37. Where a vehicle has been removed in accordance with Articles 34, 35 and 36 of this Order the charges as specified in Schedule 3 of the Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (Guidelines on Levels of Charges)(England) Order 2007 shall become payable.
38. The driver of a motor vehicle using a Parking Place within the Parking Permit Area shall not sound any horn or other similar instrument except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from a parking place.
39. No person shall, except with the permission of any person duly authorised by the Council, drive any vehicle in a Parking Place within the Parking Permit Area other than for the purpose of leaving that vehicle in that parking place in accordance with the provisions of this Order or for the purpose of departing from that parking place.
40. No person shall use any part of a Parking Place within the Parking Permit Area for:-
 - (a) sleeping or camping purposes;
 - (b) eating or cooking purposes;
 - (c) the purpose of servicing or washing any vehicle or part thereof other than is reasonably necessary to enable that vehicle to depart from that parking place.
41. No person shall play or take part in any game in a Parking Place within the Parking Permit Area.
42. In a Parking Place within the Parking Permit Area no person shall:
 - (a) erect or cause or permit to be erected any tent, booth, stand, building or other structure except with the authority of the Council; or
 - (b) light or cause or permit to be lit any fire.
43. By conspicuous notices to that effect the Council may suspend parking on any Parking Place within the Parking Permit Area or part thereof and failure to observe such notices shall be a contravention of this Order.
44. A driver of a vehicle shall not use a Parking Place within the Parking Permit Area –
 - (a) so as unreasonably to prevent access to any premises adjoining the road, or the use of the road by other persons, or
 - (b) so as to be a nuisance; or
 - (c) when for preventing obstruction of the streets, or danger or for any other lawful purpose, the Council has closed that Parking Place and exhibited notice of such closing on or near that parking place.
