

**THE NORFOLK COUNTY COUNCIL (NORWICH, QUEEN STREET)**  
**(PEDESTRIANISATION) EXPERIMENTAL TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDER 2022**

The Norfolk County Council in exercise of powers under sections 1, 2, 4 and 122 and Parts III and IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby make the following Order:-

1. Citation and Commencement

This Order may be cited as The Norfolk County Council (Norwich, Queen Street) (Pedestrianisation) Experimental Traffic Regulation Order 2022 and shall come into effect for all purposes on the 4<sup>th</sup> day of June 2022.

2. This Order shall remain in force for a period of 18 months.


3. The Norfolk County Council's Executive Director Community and Environmental Services, or a person authorised by him, is hereby empowered to modify or suspend the operation of this Order to the extent permitted by section 10 of the Act.

4. Article 2 of the Norwich City Council Queen Street Pedestrianisation Traffic Regulation Order 2003 is hereby amended to read as follows:-

“2. Subject to Article 3 below, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in Queen Street, Norwich between 0001 hours and 0300 hours and between 1900 hours and 2400 hours and between 1000 and 1600 hours on any day.”

5. Insofar as any provision of this Order conflicts with any provision of any previous Order relating to the lengths of road specified in the Schedules to this Order, that provision of this Order shall prevail.
