

**THE NORFOLK COUNTY COUNCIL  
(NORWICH CITY CENTRE CONTROLLED PARKING ZONE)  
(CASTLE MEADOW, RED LION STREET, ST STEPHENS STREET)  
AMENDMENT TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDER 2022**

The Norfolk County Council propose to make the above Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effects of which will be to amend The Norwich City Council City Centre Controlled Parking Zone (Consolidation) Traffic Regulation Order 2003 (as amended) by adjusting the current waiting, loading and unloading restrictions to make the following changes to bus, taxi and Demand Responsive Transport (DRT) vehicles as follows:-

Castle Meadow –

Western side outside of Nos. 3a & b (o/s the British Heart Foundation)

- (i) to install a new 12 metre hackney carriage taxi rank by removing 12 metres of no loading at any time; and
- (ii) to increase the length of the existing DRT bay to 8.5 metres by reducing the existing 30 minutes loading bay to an overall length of 14 metres.

Red Lion Street – Western side outside of Nos. 17-27 (o/s 5 Guys)

to install a new 6 metre full time hackney carriage taxi rank by reducing an existing dual use 30 minutes loading bay/evening hackney carriage taxi rank to an overall length of 13 metres.

St Stephens Street – from the St Stephens Roundabout to Rampant Horse Street


- (i) replacing the existing 10 bus stops to provide 12 new bus stops (with 6 on either side of the street) between the roundabout and Surrey Street (o/s of Nos. 15-23, 29-37, 55-63, 14-18a, 26-32 and 48-62).
- (ii) to remove a DRT vehicle bay outside of No. 13; and
- (iii) to move the existing 30 metre hackney carriage taxi rank from outside of Nos.14-20 (o/s Lakeland) to a new 22 metre rank outside of Nos. 2-10 (o/s M&S)
