

Your views on Norfolk County Council's Post16 Transport Policy Statement

Opens 19 May 2023

Closes 9 June 2023

Overview

This is our Post16 Transport Policy Statement consultation which asks for feedback on proposed changes to the way we help with transport for students in post-16 education – in this case, to the Post16 Travel Scheme.

Norfolk County Council works with local bus and train operators to offer subsidised travel for eligible students aged between 16 and 18 years old, travelling to their sixth form, college, or other education provider. This is part of the Council's statutory duty.

We want to review our policy to make sure we offer the best value for money and meet the needs of our families and young people. Whenever we are looking to make changes to the Post16 Travel Scheme we consider and test the impact on young people and their families. We have considered both the challenging financial climate for Norfolk County Council, the increased cost of living for our families and the impact any changes will have on our children and young people.

Norfolk County Council continues to face higher costs and demand for services, which was the case even before the recent rise in inflation. Initial proposals to save £13 million as part of a £60 million target for next year were considered by councillors on 3 October 2022. One of those savings proposals was to save £100,000 by changing the way we deliver the Post16 Travel Scheme - following consideration of the potential impact on increased costs for families, this will not be implemented for the 2023/24 academic year.

We are proposing to increase the cost of parental contributions (how much families/young people pay for) the Post16 Travel Scheme by 3% for the academic year 2023/24. We usually increase the cost of the Scheme each year in-line with inflation. However, current cost of living pressures and after speaking to post-16 education providers, we are proposing not to match the rate of inflation this year and instead apply a 3% increase.

To make sure we continue to support families with varying circumstances, we will continue to fund transport in exceptional cases and on a case-by-case basis.

Any future changes that are considered for 23/24 will involve further consultation which will be completed at the earliest possible time.

Why your views matter

We are proposing to increase the cost of all payment options (daily, annual, termly, and half-termly) by 3%. This is less than the 5.5% expected inflationary increase. We would like to find out current and future users and their families' views about the proposal.

Introduction

We are considering making changes to the Post16 Travel Scheme. These changes involve increasing the overall cost of the scheme (parental contributions) by 3%.

In 2015 the Government increased the age at which <u>young people must continue in education or training to 18.</u> Although young people must now remain in education or training until they are 18, the Government has not increased the age range of free transport available to eligible young people in line with this. Free transport is still only available to eligible children up to the age of 16.

We currently work with 15 bus and train operators across Norfolk to offer subsidised travel for eligible students, aged between 16 and 18, who are travelling to sixth forms, sixth form colleges, colleges and further education settings across the county. This is known as the Post16 Travel Scheme.

We receive payments from students/their families through this scheme and provide young people with a ticket to use on a bus or train service. This service is operated by the bus or train provider, and therefore students need to use the routes/timetable available.

Who is eligible for the Post16 Travel Scheme?

The Post16 Travel Scheme offers support to students who study at school sixth forms, sixth form colleges and further education colleges.

To qualify for the Post16 Travel Scheme, students must:

- Live in Norfolk, at least three miles from the sixth form or college (this is measured by the nearest walking route).
- Transport will also be provided for Easton College students living outside Norfolk if a student travels on the direct routes funded by the College.
- Be studying full-time (at least 540 hours per year supervised study approximately 14 hours per week).
- Be under 19 years of age on 1 September, or under 25 years of age for students with special educational needs (SEN) (transport will be provided up to the end of the course year in which the student reaches 19 or 25).
- Be studying a course of further education, not a Higher National Diploma (HND), Higher National Certificate (HNC) or degree course.
- Travel on a route determined by us.
- If your child has an Education Health and Care Plan (EHCP) there is no need to apply for travel assistance as the Travel Independence Training Team (TITAN) are already assessing who is entitled to travel assistance. If independent travel training might be appropriate for your child, you will hear directly from one of the TITAN team.
- Students who meet the above criteria can live anywhere in the county and still receive support, as long as they can get to a pick-up point on a core route that serves their sixth form or college.

What is a local authority's duty in relation to post-16 travel assistance?

Local authorities do not have to provide free or subsidised post-16 travel assistance. They do have a duty to prepare and publish a transport policy statement specifying the arrangements for the provision of transport, or other assistance that the authority considers it necessary to make to facilitate the attendance of all persons of sixth form age receiving education or training.

All young people carrying on their education post-16 must re-apply for travel assistance. 'Sixth form age' refers to those young people who are over 16 years of age but under 19 (school years 12, 13 and 14). Local authorities also have a duty to encourage, enable and assist young people with learning difficulties/disabilities to participate in education and training up to the age of 25.

The term 'post-16' (in relation to our policy) includes both learners of sixth form age and those with learning difficulties/disabilities up to the age of 25. This policy document specifies the assistance that Norfolk County Council considers necessary to facilitate the attendance of post-16 learners receiving education or training.

Education or training refers to learning or training at a school, further education institution, a council maintained or assisted institution providing higher or further education, an establishment funded directly by the Education Skills Funding Agency or other learning providers as determined by Norfolk County Council. Summary of Policy Statement and Main Objectives Norfolk County Council offers the Post16 Travel Scheme which provides a level of support for students to access post-16 education at a school sixth form, sixth form college or further education learning establishment.

Our current approach

Through the Post16 Travel Scheme, the subsidised amount can currently be paid in the following ways:

- One annual payment for the full amount £576. If you're receiving a qualifying benefit, you will pay a reduced amount of £432.
- Pay in three instalments, one for each term £192 each term. If you're receiving a qualifying benefit, you'll pay a reduced amount of £144 per term.
- Pay in six instalments, one for each half term £96 each term. If you're receiving a qualifying benefit, you'll pay a reduced amount of £72 per half term.
- Pay daily the Daily Payer Pass is a subsidised fare pass on some routes (depending on ticket machines) which is paid on the bus every day - standard charge per day is £3.30. If you're receiving a qualifying benefit, you'll pay £2.80 per day.

Discounted rates are also offered by some education providers. Most local operators offer discounted fares for students, and they are often cheaper than Norfolk County Council's Post16 Travel Scheme.

Proposed changes to our approach

We are proposing to increase the cost of all payment options by 3% as part of our annual increase. If approved, this would come into place for the 2023/24 academic year.

Impact of 3% increase on the cost of travel

We will continue to consider the use of discretionary powers to fund transport in exceptional cases and on a case-by-case basis.

Students will continue to be able to use bus and train providers' own subsidised schemes, which are often cheaper than Norfolk County Council's Post16 Travel Scheme. Students will also be able to continue to access discounted offers from colleges, sixth forms and education providers directly.

Information about travel for students with an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP)

We are proposing to increase the cost of all payment options by 3% as part of our annual increase. Those aged over 19, up to the age of 25, with an EHCP will not be impacted as they receive free travel.
