

THE NORFOLK COUNTY COUNCIL
(LONG STRATTON AND THARSTON, SWAN LANE)
(20 M.P.H. SPEED LIMIT ZONE) ORDER 2013

The Norfolk County Council in exercise of its powers under Section 84 and 122 and parts III and IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), having given public notice in accordance with sub-section (2) of that section and having consulted the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with paragraph 20 of Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby makes the following Order:

1. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to proceed at a speed exceeding 20 miles per hour along the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this Order.
2. The following Order will become revoked on the date of commencement of this Order as follows:-

"The Norfolk County Council (Long Stratton and Tharston)(20 m.p.h. Speed Limit) Order 2000" – insofar as that Order refers to its entry for Swan Lane in the Schedule to that Order.
3. No speed limit imposed by this Order applies to vehicles falling within regulation 3(4) of the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces)(Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011 when used in accordance with Regulation 3(5) of those Regulations.
4. This Order shall come into force on the 11th day of January 2013 and may be cited as the Norfolk County Council (Long Stratton and Tharston, Swan Lane)(20 m.p.h. Speed Limit Zone) Order 2013.
5. Insofar as any provision of this Order conflicts with any provision of any previous Order relating to the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this Order, that provision of this Order shall prevail.
