Dear Residents and Businesses,

Consultation on proposals for Yarmouth Road near Pound Lane, Norwich

Norfolk County Council is asking for feedback on proposed changes to Yarmouth Road on its approach to the mini roundabout with Pound Lane. We are writing to let you know how to find out more about the project and how to take part in our consultation.

This project is part of a series of improvements we're making in the city, aimed at improving bus journey times and reliability of services across our public transport network. We're using funding awarded to us by the Department for Transport for our Bus Service Improvement Plan to invest in infrastructure at strategic locations, relieving specific areas of congestion that affect buses so we can deliver better, more punctual services. Through these changes, along with funding for additional and extended services, the current £2 fare cap and zero-emission buses, we hope that more people will choose the bus for their everyday journeys into and around Norwich.

What's being proposed and why

This project is making changes to Yarmouth Road on its approach to the roundabout with Pound Lane. It is designed to create more space for buses and general traffic to help relieve congestion, which can cause delays for all road users. By improving flow for all traffic, this will reduce delays and improve journey times and punctuality for buses at the same time.

The table below explains what changes we're proposing and the reasons behind them. The enclosed plan shows what the project would look like on the ground – the numbered proposed changes below correspond to the relevant points marked on the map.

All road markings in the area will be refreshed as part of the scheme.

Next Steps

The deadline for comments is Wednesday 20 March and we will carefully consider all responses ahead of advertisement of the formal Traffic Regulation Orders needed to deliver the project. This will be done in consultation with the local county council member and cabinet member, as appropriate. The webpage above will be kept up to date with the latest progress and information.

Background

The Department for Transport (DfT) has awarded the county council nearly £50m of funding for its Bus Service Improvement Plan, aimed at improving bus services and infrastructure facilities across the county. The plan includes measures such as integrated travel hubs, new and more frequent services and bus priority infrastructure schemes such as this project at the Yarmouth Road roundabout with Pound Lane.
