Overview

Adult social care covers a wide range of activities to enable people to live independently, stay well and safe.

Promoting Independence is the term we use to describe our vision for social care. We want to support people to be *independent*, *well*, *and able to deal with life's challenges* and we want to talk to you about how we will do this.

You may have heard about Adult Social Care in the news, and some of the challenges it faces. Norfolk has a changing and growing population so we must plan for our services to be long-lasting and financially stable.

With your help we want to update our strategy for Social Care in Norfolk. We want to hear from you as we passionately believe that 'Conversations Matter'.

How can you get involved?

The online questionnaire will be live between Wednesday 28th June and Friday 1st September. We will have a range of engagement activities available over the summer and into the autumn. So, there will be lots of opportunities to be involved, you can:

- Adaptions and equipment in your home so you can stay living there if you want to.
- Using gadgets and technology to make your home safer.
- Arrange help in your home if you need it.
